18 WHEREAS, on April 19, 2004, the Court entered a Pretrial Scheduling Order setting
 19 certain deadlines in this action,
 20 WHEREAS, the April 19, 2004 Pretrial Scheduling Order required the parties to
 21 make any motion to join another party within 60 days (by June 18, 2004),
 22 WHEREAS, the April 19, 2004 Pretrial Scheduling Order required the parties to serve
 23 all interrogatories, requests for admission, requests for production, and other discovery at least forty-
 24 five days before September 3, 2004 (by July 20, 2004),
 25 WHEREAS, in an Order dated May 12, 2004, the Court granted in part the Postal
 26 Service's motion for a stay of the case for sixty days (until July 11, 2004);
 27 WHEREAS, the May 12, 2004 Order also required the Postal Service to provide
 28 plaintiffs Nigg and Lewis with the names and addresses of all postal inspectors employed by the
 Postal Service since April 7, 2001,

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WHEREAS, the reason the Postal Service was required to provide plaintiffs with the names and addresses of all postal inspectors was so that plaintiffs could inform them about the pendency of the current suit and their ability to join the action by filing a Consent to Join form,

WHEREAS, on May 25, 2004, the United States Postal Service provided the names and addresses of all postal inspectors to plaintiffs Nigg and Lewis;

WHEREAS, the filing of a Consent to Join form by postal inspectors could be considered a motion to add a party,

WHEREAS, the parties agree that the postal inspectors should have sufficient time to receive the notice and decide whether to "opt-in" to the litigation,

GU NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE that the discovery cut-off deadline is extended from September 3, 2004 until December 3, 2004,

THE PARTIES FURTHER STIPULATE AND AGREE, the date by which class members must "opt-in" to the litigation is extended from June 18, 2004 until September 18, 2004,

THE PARTIES FURTHER STIPULATE AND AGREE, that the Final Pretrial Conference will be rescheduled from December 3, 2004, 1 30 p m and will now take place on March 4, 2005, 1 30 p m or at any other time determined by the Court, and

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THE PARTIES FURTHER STIPULATE AND AGREE, that the Trial month will be rescheduled from January 2005 until April 2005.
